

ORDINANCE NUMBER 58

**AN ORDINANCE OF BERWICK TOWNSHIP, ADAMS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA,
AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 15 (ADOPTED DECEMBER 28, 1987).**

Be it enacted and ordained by Berwick Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania, and by its authority, the Board of Supervisors hereby ordains:

SECTION 1., Section 2 of the existing Ordinance is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

SECTION 2. Permit required. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause or allow an addition to any existing building or structure or the construction or placement of any building or structure to be used as residential, commercial, industrial, storage or other uses on the property owned by such person, either legally or equitably, without first having obtained a permit and the total cost of the said addition, construction or placement exceeds Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars.

SECTION 2. Section 12 of the existing Ordinance is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

SECTION 12. Expiration of permit. If any work authorized by any permit issued under this Ordinance shall not have been commenced within six (6) months of the date of issuance or it is not substantially completed within twenty-four (24) months of issuance, then the permit shall be invalid. In such an event, that person shall need to begin the application process again for a new permit. No fees shall be returned on an expired permit


SECTION 3. Repealer. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. Severability. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is found to be for any reason unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality, or invalidity such not affect or impair any of the remaining revisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared that the intent of the Board of Supervisors of Berwick Township that this Ordinance would not have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, sentence, clause, section or part thereof not been included herein.

SECTION 5. Valid date. This Ordinance shall become effective five (5) days after its enactment.
